

- Subscribe to threads you are interested in you get copies of posts delivered to your inbox.
- Sign in to the ISTC website and choose to remain logged in (so your username and password are remembered) - that way, you only need to click the link in a post to reply.
- To create a post (or reply), either type directly into the form or if copying/pasting from anywhere else, such as a website, an email or a Word document paste as text to prevent the formatting codes being included as part of your message.
