

New to tech comms (part 2): attending the Global Graduate Conference

In the <u>December edition of InfoPlus</u> Rachael Smith wrote about what it's like to work as graduate information developer at ARM. This month she writes about her experience attending ARM's Global Graduate Conference.

One of the major events for a graduate in the first year at ARM is the Global Graduate Conference. This event brings together all the graduates who started in the last year for five days of talks, activities, and networking. The conference was my first opportunity to really get to know the other new graduates from my own office in Cambridge, alongside meeting other graduates from around the world. Being in such a global company, it is likely that collaboration with other offices will be necessary at some point in my career. It is reassuring to know that there will now be a familiar face in most of them.

The talks at the conference covered a range of topics, from more general talks about ARM to talks specific to particular areas of work. The talks were broken up with group activities such as a business simulation and a "conference energizer". The business simulation was designed to teach us about licensing, a core part of what ARM does, while the energizer involved a box of incredibly fun and silly activities that each group competed with the others to complete. I think many people went away very proud of their new found plate spinning skills.

One topic that came up many times at the conference was that of diversity and inclusion, particularly in relation to gender. I have to admit that talks including target percentages of women in tech companies can make me uncomfortable. Being female. I do not want to feel like I was hired to improve the statistics. I also do not want the men working around me to think this. I was therefore very keen to learn more about what ARM is doing to fix the problem at the opposite end. ARM has links with various initiatives that aim to get children of both genders interested in STEM, and maintain that interest as they decide which subjects they will continue to study. These initiatives

include Code Club, which is an after school club, mentoring, and The Big Bang Fair. Hopefully these initiatives will result in greater diversity in technical subjects in schools and universities, and ultimately greater diversity in job candidates.

A group of graduates plan and organize the ARM stand at The Big Bang Fair each year and I was accepted onto the team for 2017. I am particularly interested in getting involved in visiting schools and talking to teachers about what they would find useful to take away from the fair. We will then create some educational materials that are based on these discussions to allow us to have a lasting positive impact long after the show has ended.
