In October's meeting, five of us attended and shared/compared war stories, success stories, ideas, notes and articles. Some members are struggling to prove the value of technical communications in their organisation; others are better appreciated and able to get on with the core job more effectively. The level of appreciation for technical communications seems to correlate well with the maturity of the organisation. The cultural shift required to move up in maturity seems to be a big barrier.

However, even where there is better acceptance, there's still plenty of room to establish greater value. Doing so could be useful in the argument against off-shoring. Positioning technical communications as a clear profit centre may combat the impulse for cost-cutting at the expense of quality.

It was noted that off-shoring can be made to work in more mature organisations, but typically it fails through lack of effective governance. Motorola was cited as an example where off-shoring failed horribly at the first attempt.

Members noted some other functions that are prime candidates as allies for technical communications; in particular: marketing, sales and training.
