
The Pursuits of a Polymath

Inspired by TCUK's theme this year, I decided to see if any polymaths (other than Elon Musk) had hit the headlines recently and was pleased to discover this in-depth article in the Observer: People With 'Too Many Interests' More Likely to be Successful, According to Research.

There are many well-known polymaths, both historical and contemporary: Leonardo da

Vinci, Marie Curie, Thomas Edison, Steve Jobs and Bill Gates are just a handful. But have you ever thought of yourself as a polymath? The author of this piece, Michael Simmons, defines a modern polymath as 'someone who becomes competent in at least three diverse domains and integrates them into a top 1-percent skill set'. He argues that 'being a modern polymath is the new normal', and that it has distinct advantages over being a specialist.

Increasingly in recent times, technical communicators report that they need to be proficient in multiple skills, and this requirement to be a 'jack of all trades, master of some' can feel challenging at times. But actually, would you want it any other way?



D is for Daventry

Ending this edition as it began, with a nod to the new school year. Daventry is hosting TCUK 2018 this month, so here are a few random facts about the area:

- Until the 1990s, the BBC transmitted the World Service from shortwave transmitters on Borough Hill, to the east of the town. The hill is a good place to go for excellent views and a relaxing walk.
- Silverstone, the home of the British Grand Prix, is nearby. And like the ISTC, the circuit is celebrating its 70th anniversary this year.

- One for the history buffs among you. During the English Civil Wars, Daventry was the headquarters of Charles I before the Battle of Naseby (1645) between Royalist and Parliamentarian forces.
- The famous <u>Watford Gap</u> is located on the A5/M1 north-east of Daventry, which means it is officially, although only just, down south.



The world's first radar demonstration took place near Daventry in 1935. The technology's pioneer, Robert Watson-Watt, was able to detect the passage of an RAF Handley Page bomber using equipment mounted in a Flatnose Morris van parked in a field near Weedon (a little outside the town).
