### Illustrating the message more effectively

The communication of information by pictures, although universally agreed to be superior to the written word in terms of efficiency and immediacy of communication, has its drawbacks. The major one is cost of production. However, there is a trade-off, since illustrating resources commonly attract lower rates than, say, authoring resources. # Graphics, visualisation and XML

XMLUK, the British XML and SGML users' group, is holding a one-day conference at the government's Rutherford Appleton Laboratories on 21 February 2002 on the subject of graphics and XML. In fact, the major focus of the event seems to be on the emerging SVG standard (Structured Vector Graphics). This can be seen, if you like, as an Open Source alternative to Macromedia's Shockwave format for animated and interactive content, and it has the

interesting twist that SVG graphics are encoded in text form, as XML. This offers the possibility of graphics on the Web being generated "on the fly" in response to database queries.

# Sevensteps 3.2 announced

Sevensteps has announced the beta of version 3.2 of its help authoring system. This new version allows the production of HTML Help, and the beta can be downloaded from the web at [www.sevensteps.com](http://www.sevensteps.com). Also available for download are various demos and utilities — including a beautifully-executed free project planning and costing spreadsheet that runs under Microsoft Excel.

One leading international investment bank in London is using Sevensteps as the sole help authoring tool for online help in its Middle and Back Office IT functions. The bank's sole author likes it because of its:

- clean, simple, browser-independent HTML output
- topic type concept
- fast authoring environment
- responsive and capable support team.
